Instructions for Authors:

- Submission deadline is July 14, 2024.
- Send your paper electronically in a Word document to Jerry Harris (<u>gharris234@comcast.net</u>).
- Your paper must be complete, including citations and a list of references.
- Maximum word count = **10,000 words**.
- ** Include in your paper your full name, affiliation including location, email address, a 100-word abstract, keywords and a short biography.
- Use the following formatting and citation guidelines (see the American Sociological Association (ASA) Style Guide for more information):
 - **Page Margins:** 1 inch all around.
 - Headers or Footers: NONE
 - Page Numbers: NONE
 - **Line Spacing:** Single, no spacing before or after paragraphs.
 - First Paragraph Indentation: NONE
 - Subsequent Paragraph Indentation: First Line by 0.25".
 - **Font:** Times New Roman, 12pt.
 - Level 1 Subtitles: Bold text. One blank line before and after subtitle.
 - Level 2 Subtitles: Italicized text. One blank line before and after subtitle.
 - Footnotes Only
 - **Inline Quotations:** Double quotation marks.
 - **Block Quotation:** No quotation marks. One blank line before and after quote. Left indent 0.5". Times New Roman, 12pt. font.
 - Word or Phrase Emphasis: Double quotation marks.
 - **Emphasis (within a quotation):** Single quotation marks.
 - **Citations in Text:** Sentence period after citation. Examples:
 - Single author without a quote (Smith 1996).
 - Single author with a quote (Smith 1996:120–121).
 - Two authors (Nussbaum and Sen 1993) or (Nussbaum and Sen 1993:12– 16).
 - Three or more authors (Jones et al. 1991) or (Jones et al. 1991:1–3).

- Multiple authors cited for a given observation listed in alphabetical order (Gonzolez 1970; Lee 1990; Park 1980) or (Gonzolez 1970:1; Lee 1990:2– 3; Park 1980:5).
- Multiple references by same author (Gaitzanwa 1992, 1994, 2000) or (Gaitzanwa 1992:9, 1994:100-101, 2000:5-6).
- Multiple references by same author or authors in same year (Stigletz 1994a, 1994b) or (Stigletz 1994a:1, 1994b:6).


